Develop "Cultural Intelligence" (CQ) by collaborating with peers from at least three different European countries to understand different educational systems.

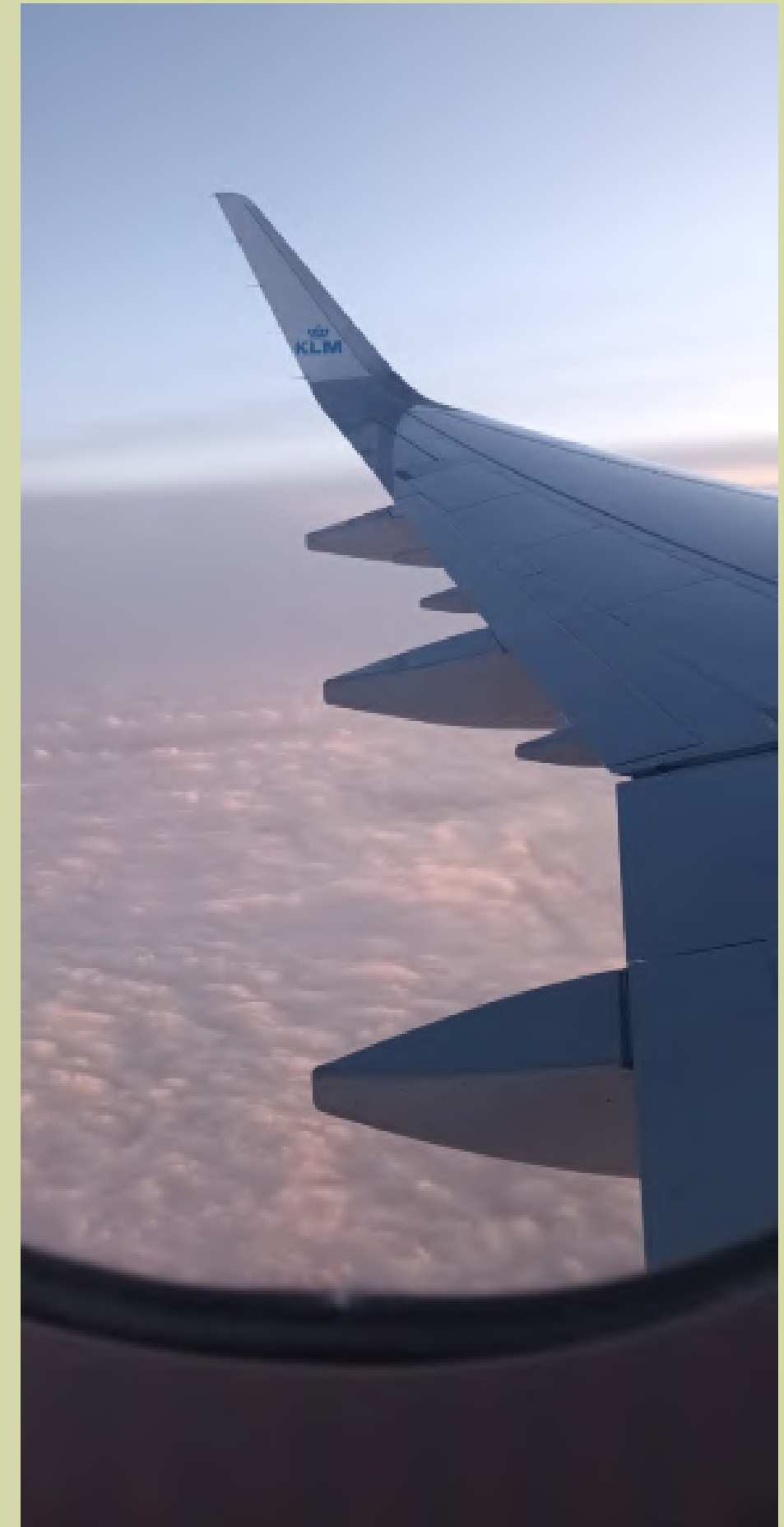

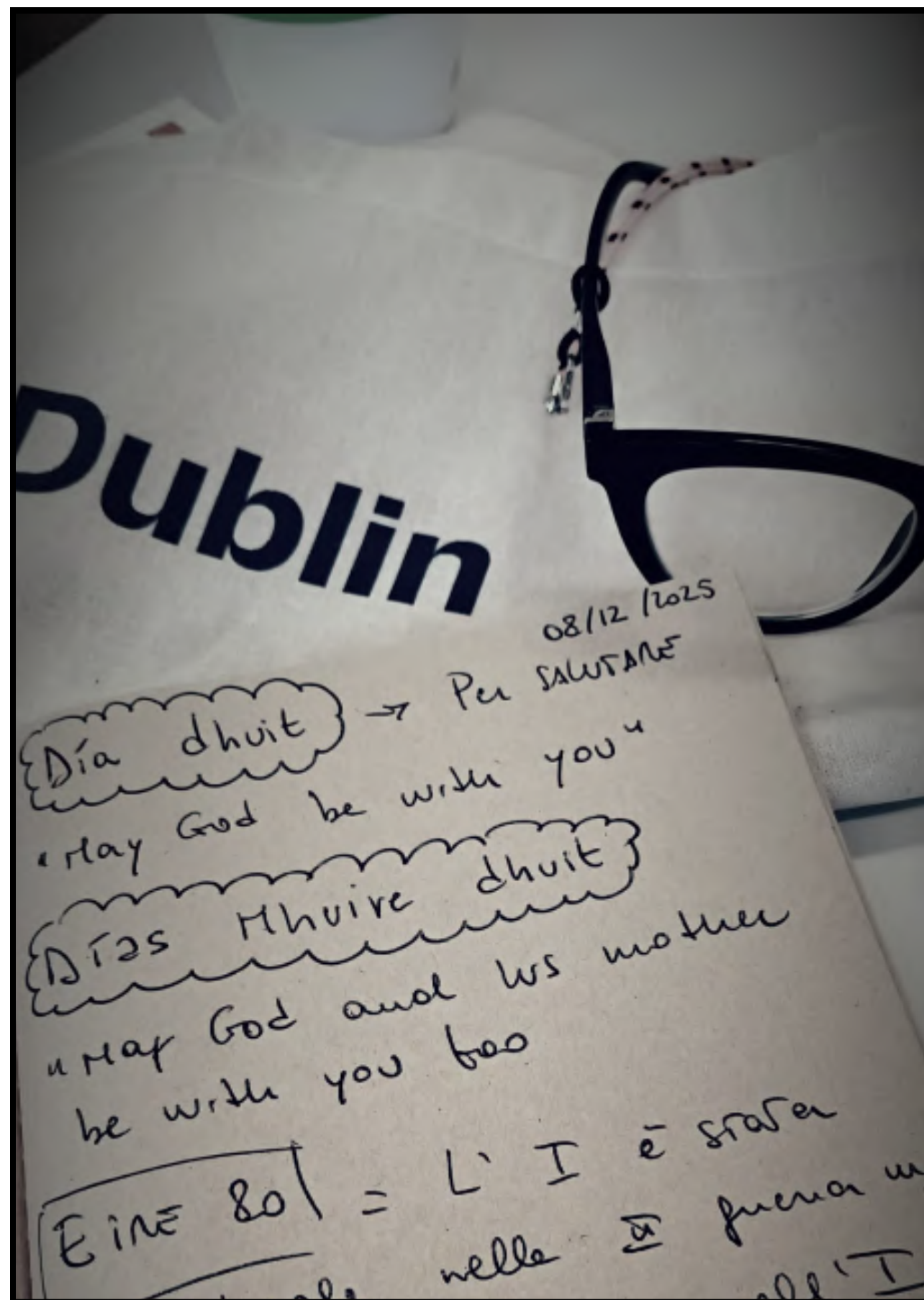
The Teacher Academy

The "Teacher Academy Dublin" usually refers to the Europass Teacher Academy, one of the largest and most established providers of Erasmus+ staff mobility in Ireland. Their presentation of a 5-day course is designed to be highly practical, ensuring teachers leave with "ready-to-use" materials for their classrooms.

Here is the core breakdown of their Dublin-based program presentation for 2026:

The academy focuses on "21st-century pedagogies," shifting from traditional lecturing to active, student-led learning. Their presentation highlights four pillars:

1. Practicality: Every morning session ends with a "takeaway" tool or activity.
2. Multiculturalism: Groups are intentionally mixed to include teachers from across the EU.
3. Wellbeing: A heavy focus on "Soft Skills" and "Teacher Mindfulness" to combat burnout.
4. Certification: Guaranteed provision of the Europass Mobility Certificate and the Learning Agreement signatures required for your grant.

- Collaborative Learning: Irish teaching culture emphasizes teamwork and group projects!

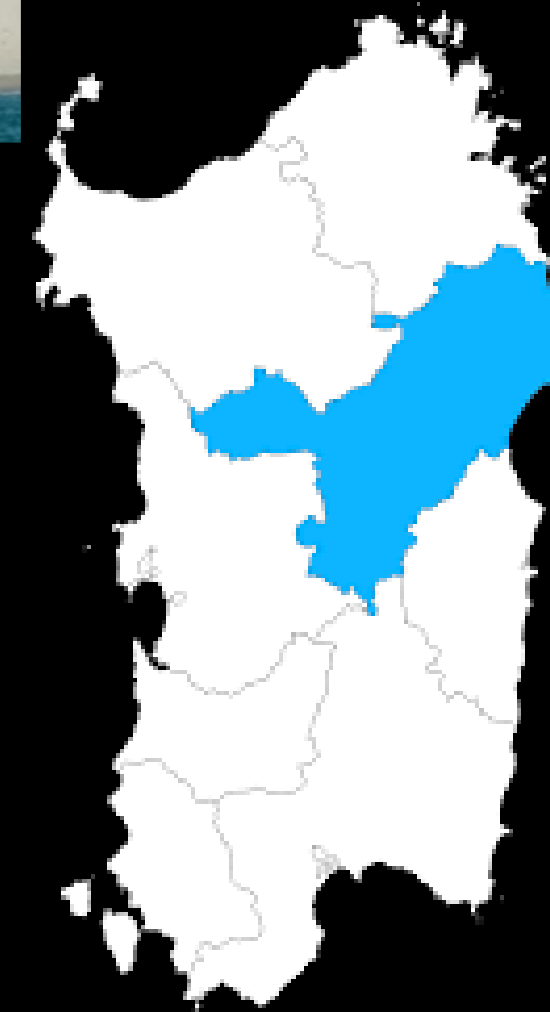


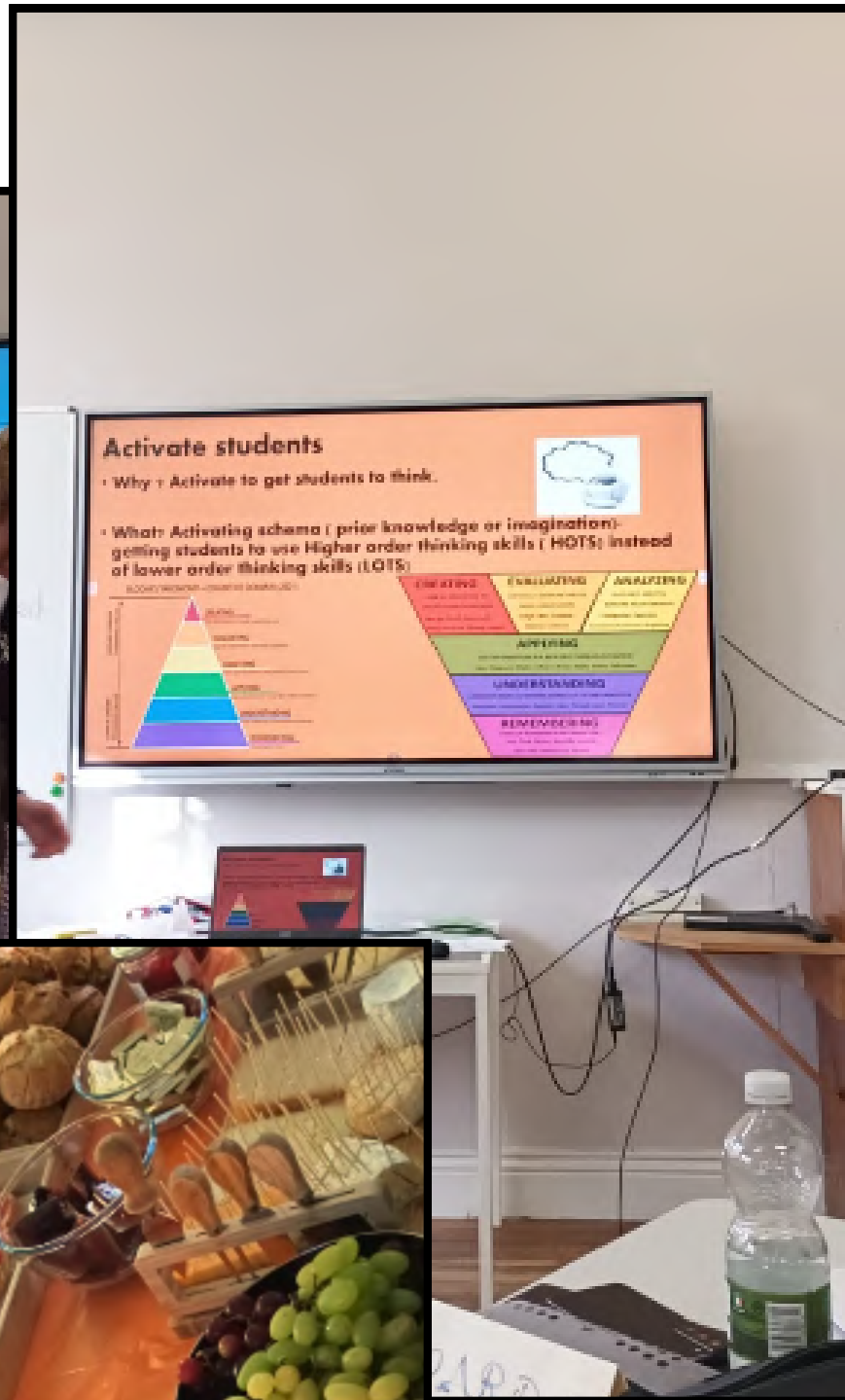
